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Winter Preparedness Tips

Winter is quickly approaching, which means snow and temperatures will be falling (if they haven't already)! Here are some things that animal welfare organizations with physical locations should keep in mind to keep their staff, animals, and property safe:

- Keep on eye on local weather forecast for any upcoming snowfall or ice forecasts.
- When snow and/or ice is prevalent on property, make sure all indoor/outdoor walkways and pathways are clear for staff, patrons, and animals to prevent slip and fall hazards.
- For animal sanctuaries and other facilities that have outdoor property susceptible to the cold temperatures (locks on gates, vehicles, etc.), make sure to check them routinely in the cold winter months and perform maintenance where necessary.

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
